



2020 Monroe County Fair Queen & Princess Rules & Guidelines

*Deadline to apply: May 28, 2020 *online form*

Pageant Date: June 20, 2020 at 7pm

1. Queen contestant age requirements- 16 - 22 years old:

Each contestant must be at least 16 years of age at the time of the contest, and cannot have turned 22 years of age on or before June 1, 2021. Only those that will be 18 years of age by June 1, 2021 will be eligible to be crowned the 2020 Monroe County Fair Queen. Any contestant that will not be 18 by June 1, 2021 is only eligible to be on the Queen's court.

Princess contest age requirements- 12-15 years old:

Each contestant must be at least 12 years of age at the time of the contest and cannot turn 16 before the 2020 contest.

2. Each contestant must be a Monroe County resident, a U.S. citizen and represent their home county. One the contestant's parents or legal guardians must also be an Indiana resident. The only exception: the contest may reside in an adjoining Indiana county if the majority of their activities are in the county in which they entered the contest. Should a fair represent more than one county, the winning contestant must reside in one of the participating counties.

3. Each contestant must be an active member of at least one worthwhile organization in their community, such as church groups, Scouts, 4-H, etc. Eligibility is not limited to 4-H membership.

4. No professional model is eligible for the Monroe County Fair Queen or Princess Pageant. (A professional model is one who earns a livelihood by modeling.) A contestant, who has had training or schooling in the modeling field, has been paid on occasion for modeling or works for a fashion board is not considered a professional model.

5. Any contestant who had competed in the Indiana State Fair Queen Pageant cannot compete again.

6. The young woman crowned as the 2020 Monroe County Fair Queen will be the county representative at the 2021 Indiana State Fair Queen pageant. Only the county winner (or the First Runner-Up, if the winner becomes ineligible; the Second Runner-Up if the First Runner-Up is unavailable, etc.) may represent the county at the 2021 Indiana State Fair Queen Pageant.

7. Contestants should give thoughtful consideration to their use of social media and be advised the Monroe County Fair Queen & Princess Committee reviews all contestants' internet presence for appropriate online behavior. Additionally, the Indiana State Fair Queen pageant also reviews the social media of each county representative to the state pageant.

8. If any of the previous conditions listed in these qualifications are not followed by the contestant, the Monroe County Fair Queen & Princess Pageant chair has the right to disqualify that contestant from the competition.

9. Each contestant will receive an official 2020 Monroe County Fair Queen & Princess Pageant T-shirt, which will be worn during the introductions portion of the pageant on Saturday night, June 20, 2020.

10. Monroe County Fair Queen & Princess Pageant contestants will be judged on the basis of: poise, personality and ability to converse.

For the Winners:

1. The winners of the Monroe County Fair Queen & Princess pageant will receive the titles of "Miss Monroe County 2020" and the "2020 Fair Queen" and "2020 Monroe County Princess" respectively and must be prepared to spend the entire 7-day period at the 2020 Monroe County Fair on the fairgrounds.
2. The winners must agree to appear for the Monroe County Fair Board of Directors in official capacities as required throughout the year until a successor is crowned. All appearances made by the 2020 Fair Queen & Princess in official capacity must be approved by the Monroe County Fair Queen & Princess co-chairs.
3. The winners must agree to not accept another pageant title or endorse any commercial product as "Miss Monroe County Fair Queen or Princess" for 12 months following the 2020 Monroe County Fair Queen & Princess pageant without the written permission of the Monroe County Fair Board of Directors.
4. The winners will receive all prizes, gifts and awards at the end of the Monroe County Fair.
5. The winners will need to be connected to the pageant co-chairs on Facebook and Instagram. Each will also have access to the pageant accounts for posting throughout the year.

The judging is divided into three divisions:

I. Interview – 50 points total

- A. Ability to converse – 20 points
- B. Personality – 15 points
- C. Poise – 15 points

Attire for Interview: Black and white attire, i.e., skirt, pants, or suit of black with a white shirt or blouse (no jackets). No t-shirts or colored bras allowed.

What to Expect: Each contestant will have one five-minute interview with each of the three judges; therefore, each contestant will give three separate interviews, for a total of 15 minutes, answering impromptu questions asked by each judge.

Interviews will be conducted on Saturday, June 20, 2020, and are private and are not open to the public.

II. Professional Wear & Prepared Speech (QUEEN) & Casual Wear & Impromptu Question (Princess) – 30 points total

- A. Posture and poise – 10 points
- B. Overall impression – 10 points
- C. 1-minute speech on a topic of your choice – 10 points (QUEEN CONTESTANTS ONLY)
- D. Impromptu question – 10 points (PRINCESS CONTESTANTS ONLY)

Prepared Speech: Each contestant will prepare a speech no longer than one (1) minute, on the topic of their choice. Speeches will be scored on natural speaking ability, delivery, poise and originality. Props, music and audio-visuals will not be allowed.

Attire for Professional Wear: Suit or other professional wear. A suit does not have to be of the same fabric – separates are allowed – and does not need to be a skirt/pants or jacket. Dresses and pant suits are also allowed.

Attire for Casual Wear: Sunday dress or graduation event outfit, such as dress pants or skirt with a blouse, or a dress or something you'd wear out with friends. NO jeans, t-shirts or bras showing. When choosing a dress, please make sure that the dress is no more than 2 inches above the knee and is modest in cut. The judges may discount an inappropriate dress for the County pageant.

Public judging will take place on Saturday night, June 20, 2020 at 7pm.

III. Formal Wear (QUEEN) & Celebration Attire (PRINCESS)– 20 points total

A. Posture and poise – 10 points

B. Overall impression – 10 points

Attire for Formal Wear: Formal gown or tuxedo. When choosing a formal gown, at least one portion of the hemline must be floor length (touching the floor or contestant's foot). A gown with the skirt split above the knee (more than 2 inches above the kneecap), a low-cut bodice, and/or a cut or design that is judged inappropriate for the Monroe County Queen Pageant may be discounted by the judges.

Attire for Celebration Attire: Something you would wear to a dance, celebration, wedding, etc. When choosing an outfit for this portion of the pageant, please keep in mind that there are to be NO FORMALS (nothing floor length). Outfit must be age appropriate. Length of dress or skirt should be nothing above the kneecap and no low-cut bodices. Any outfit judged inappropriate for the Monroe County Princess Pageant may be discounted by the judges.

Public judging will take place on Saturday night, June 20, 2020 at 7pm.

NOTE: Failure to comply with the above requirements could result in the loss of judging points. Points and score sheets are for the judges' assessment only. Final selection is the judges' decision. The Monroe County Fair Queen Pageant co-chairs reserve the right to change the foregoing terms and conditions at any time as may be deemed expedient.
